The Fire Precautions Work Place Regulations 1999

The Management of Health and Safety at Work Regulations 1999 call for a detailed Fire Risk Assessment to be carried out by a competent person.

Objectives

To reduce the risk to your organisation from Fire, all employers are required to carry out a formal Fire Risk Assessment in order to eliminate or control the risks.
